

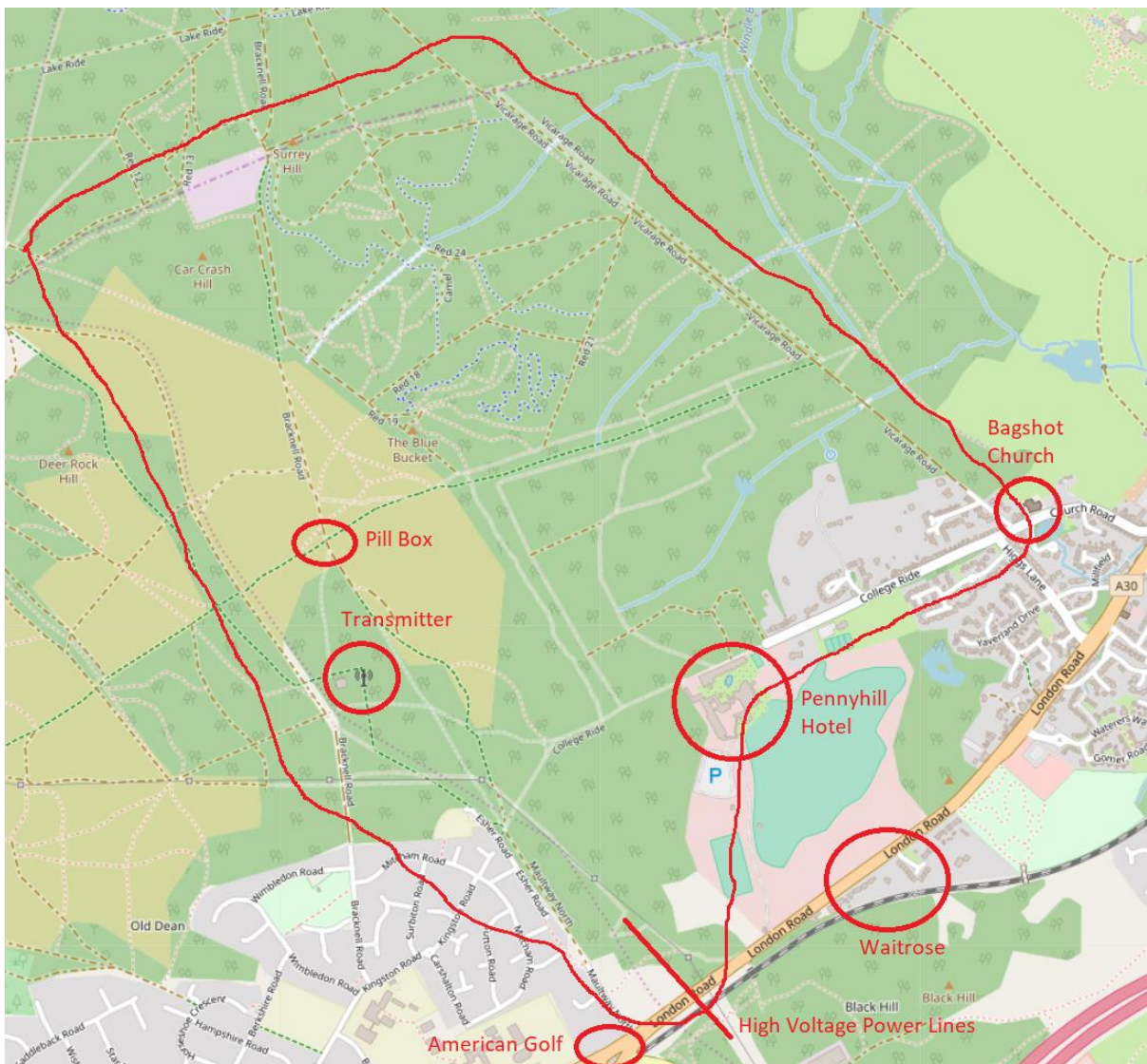
Surrey Hill and Bagshot Woods

Surrey Hill and the area to the south is the area to head for when you want to run up and down hills. Surrey Hill itself can be climbed by at least 6 different routes, and the hills behind can be tougher still. Part of this area is quite open, and part of it forested albeit that quite a lot of trees in this area have been felled recently.

From the base of Surrey Hill (facing it), turn left towards Rapley Lake, then take the 2nd right track. This is Vicarage Road, which will take you to Bagshot and out of the woods to the south.

The transmitter tower is an obvious landmark. Just beyond are the high voltage transmission lines; follow these down to the A30 where you can exit the woods by American Golf, or via a track that leads down to the A30, where you can cross, pass under the railway and head into more Woodland towards the M3 and Lightwater.

The woods are quite complicated, but not as large as you think, and there are good trails to be found up to and alongside Pennyhill Hotel and in the area towards the A30. To exit the area, head due north which will take you to or near to Surrey Hill. From The Look Out to Bagshot is approximately 3 miles, assuming you go the quickest route, so expect to run at least 7 miles if you explore this area.



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
